

Window Cleaning Checklist:

Supplies:

- Bucket
- Window cleaning
- Squeegee and applicator
- Microfiber cloths or lint-free towels
- Scraper (for tough spots)
- Extension pole (for high windows)
- Ladder (if necessary)
- Gloves

Pre-Cleaning Preparation

- Inspect Windows:
- Check for cracks or damage in the glass.
- Inspect window frames and sills for any damage or needed repairs.
- Remove any window screens and set aside for cleaning.

Interior Window Cleaning:

- Remove Dust and Cobwebs:
- Use a dry microfiber cloth or duster to remove dust from window frames and sills.
- Clean any cobwebs from corners and edges.
- Clean Window Tracks and Frames:
- Vacuum or brush out loose dirt and debris from tracks.
- Wipe down frames and sills with a damp cloth.
- Clean window Using squeegee and applicator

Exterior Window Cleaning

- Use a sturdy ladder if needed, ensuring it is on a stable surface.
- If using an extension pole, ensure it is secure and manageable.
- Remove Surface Dirt and Cobwebs:
- Brush off loose dirt and cobwebs from frames and sills.
- Use squeegee and applicator
- Clean flyscreens
- Clean Windows:
- Use the scraper for tough spots if necessary.

Note:

- We will not be able to remove security screens or bolted flyscreens for cleaning.
- If double storied, we need to have access to adequate water sources for the use of water poles.
- Cleaning calcium / mineral buildup will not be cleaned as it can cause damages to the glass .
